Collaboration subjects/modules of the Language Assistant	<p>The language assistant helps teachers in different levels of Compulsory Secondary Education (students who are 12-16 years old) and Vocational training (16 to years old). Information about the town and/or neighborhood	<p>Olvera belongs to the Route of White Towns, a unique group of towns in the mountains of Cadiz. It's located in a strategic area, as it is only 100 kms from the main cities in Andalucía, namely Malaga, Sevilla and Cadiz and about 150 kms from other important capital cities, such as Cordoba or Granada. Olvera has about 8.000 inhabitants and its city centre and surrounding areas offer a huge variety of entertaining activities. There is a huge number of restaurants, some shops, pubs and discos. There are two big gyms and some private sport trainers. The townhall organises multiple cultural activities such as the Autumn theatre contest, cinema, cultural routes... Here you will also enjoy traditional festivities, such as the Holy Week, Carnival, Christmas concerts and activities, and our Lunes de Quasimodo (our “romería”). It's a traditional pilgrimage to a local church located outside the town, with a picnic and traditional dancing and food. (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=kyMSUUQLOAM>) If you are interested in sports, then our Via Verde is a great option. It's an old rainway transformed into a track that links different towns and where you can go hiking, ride a bike or a horse, walk or go running. This track takes you to Zaframagon Risk, that gives name to our highschool, and the only vulture reservation in Spain. (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=odgX97mm2fE>) Olvera is a great place to live and learn traditional Spanish lifestyle without getting bored, as it has everything you may need.

Getting to school	<p>You won't need to use public transport to come to work, as you will be able to walk anywhere in the town. You can easily find them in different web pages such as: www.milanuncios.com; www.rentalia. There are some state agents, such as www.conexalia.com, where they may provide you with a list of houses/ apartments to rent.</p> <p>Our language assistants do not usually choose to stay with a local family, but it could be a possibility if you really wanted to do so, we would find a way to look for a family.</p> <p>- Contact of teachers interested in sharing a flat. Many teachers share flats here. If you are interested in sharing, it would be important to contact the coordinator of the bilingual program, so</p>

	<p>that she could get you in touch with new teachers that usually arrive in September. After this month, it is more difficult to find someone, as normally, they have already found a place to stay.</p>
